



# A.L. Kenyon House

333 Garfield Avenue  
1915, Bungalow



This rather elaborate bungalow was typical of a high-income neighborhood in the early 1900s. The contrast of stucco and shingle surfaces, the prominent horizontal framing and the use of exposed rafters form an exceptional composition which identifies the building as an architect's rather than a builder's project. More modest versions of bungalows can be seen in the Emery Street Bungalow District on the East Side Hill.
