



Gilbert Gikling House

421 Talmadge Street

This house exhibits many of the Queen Anne style characteristics and features including an asymmetrical façade with multiple gables, a combination of finishes that include clapboard and patterned shingles, and ornate turned and scroll-sawn porch details.

Gikling worked in a lumber mill in Eau Claire and ventured on logging expeditions to the North Woods. In 1910, he worked as a filer with the Linderman Box and Veneer Company. The house was still in the Gikling family in 2002.
