



Saint Edward's Chapel

1889-1896, Neo-Gothic Revival



Rev. B.F. Cooley of Christ Church, located on South Farwell Street designed and supervised the construction of the chapel that was initiated in 1889. The chapel was intended to be a mission church for Christ Church, Eau Claire's Episcopal parish, to serve the growing number of parishioners living north of the Eau Claire River. Work stopped on the chapel with Cooley's departure in 1889 and was not resumed until 1896 when a scaled back design was completed.

The chapel did not attract the parishioners hoped for and was closed in 1918. Sometime between 1923 and 1926, the chapel was converted into a single-family dwelling. Circa 1982 the interior of the building was remodeled into its current appearance.
